

Would You Rather: Four Corners

Grades 3–5 • 10 min • 16+ students

WHAT YOU NEED

- 4 sheets of paper labeled A, B, C, D (or just spoken corner names)

SETUP

Label the four corners of the room A, B, C, D before class, or just point them out and have kids remember.

HOW TO RUN IT

1. Read a "would you rather" question with four options, one per corner (e.g. "Would you rather have the power to fly, turn invisible, breathe underwater, or talk to animals?").
2. Students walk (not run) to the corner matching their answer.
3. Pick one or two students per corner to give a one-sentence reason for their choice.
4. Read the next question and repeat for 4–6 rounds.

VARIATIONS

- Tie the questions to a unit you're about to teach (e.g. history eras, book genres, science fields) as a hook for the day's lesson.
- For a small class, use hand signals (raise 1, 2, 3, or 4 fingers) instead of walking to corners.
